HAPPY NATIVE AMERICAN & ALASKAN NATIVE MONTH:



3 sisters soup

Ingredients:

- 1 of your favorite winter squash (butternut, acorn, kabocha)
- 1 tablespoon avocado oil
- 1 yellow onion diced
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- 2 quarts vegetable stock or water
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 pound corn kernels (fresh, frozen, or canned)
- 1 can (15 oz) cannellini beans drained
- 1/4 cup green onions sliced
- Salt to taste

Instructions:

1. Halve the squash and scoop out the seeds. Remove the squash seeds and skin and cube the remainder of the squash into 1-inch pieces.
2. In a large stockpot, heat the oil over medium heat, then add onions, garlic, and squash. Sauté until the onions are translucent. When the onions are soft, add spices and stir for 60 seconds.
3. Add the stock or water, corn, and beans, and simmer for 20 minutes or until the squash is fork tender.
4. Taste and adjust seasoning as needed. Enjoy!

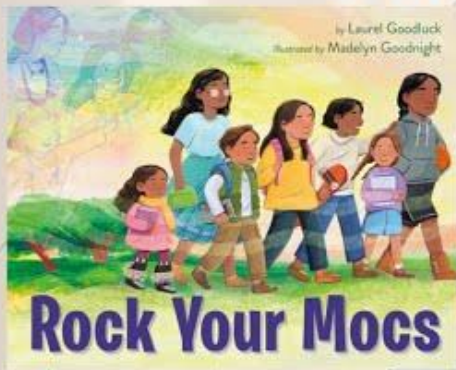



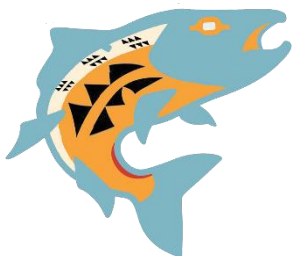

A small stipend and one night hotel room is provided. The movie takes place in the heart of the Pacific Northwest and follows the Sterling family timber empire who own and operate one of the largest and most profitable timber conglomerates in the country. As the Patriarch of the family attempts to expand their sprawling empire to keep the family business afloat against political adversaries, growing climate change, and environmental activists, tensions rise with the neighboring Eagle Claw tribe who fight to protect their ancestral land at all costs.

The Native cast includes Tatanka Means (*Killers of The Flower Moon*), Irene Bedard (*The New World*), Wes Studi (*Dances With Wolves*), Kenneth Rutherford (*Longmire*), and Grace Dove (*The Revenant*). The movie is written, directed and executive produced by Baylee Toney (*The Redeemer*) and Myles Clohessy (*The Pendragon Cycle*). The cast also includes SAG Award winner Robert Clohessy (*Blue Bloods*).

Indian Education

NATIVE AMERICAN and ALASKAN NATIVE HERITAGE MONTH:

We have a very large Native American/Alaskan Native population at the schools we serve. Here is our student count from last year.

Medford SD: 295 identified with 39 enrolled in Indian Ed

Ashland SD: 177 identified with 25 enrolled in Indian Ed

Three Rivers SD: 371 identified with 24 enrolled in Indian Ed

Grants Pass SD: 235 identified with 29 enrolled in Indian Ed

Rogue River SD: 46 identified with 4 enrolled in Indian Ed
